# PARAMEDIC

Four Semester – Diploma Program

This two-year program provides the skills and knowledge to practice emergency pre-hospital medical care and to function as an integral member of the health team in assisting victims of accident or illness. Graduates will have demonstrated the ability to apply relevant theory, practice safety competently and comply with current legislation, regulations, standards and established policies and procedures.

## **Employment Opportunities:**

Graduates of the program are eligible to write the Ministry of Health's Advanced Emergency Medical Care Attendant certification examination. If successful, they can be employed as a primary care paramedic in the province of Ontario. Graduates have been employed in ambulance services, in the field of health and safety, rescue, and dispatch.

## **Admission Requirements**

1. Ontario Secondary School Diploma.  
Courses completed at or above the General Level  
**Courses Required:**  
Grade 11 or 12 Biology at or above General Level  
Or
2. Mature Student. For mature student definition refer to page 2 of our calendar.

## **Graduates of the new Ontario high school curriculum:**

Ontario Secondary School diploma with courses from the College, University, University/College, or Open preparation levels.

**Courses Required:** Grade 11 Math, Grade 12 English, Grade 11 or 12 Biology,  
Grade 11 or 12 Chemistry

## **Other Requirements**

To qualify for clinical/field placements, students must present the following prior to the start of classes:

- 1) Proof of current Standard First Aid and Basic Rescuer CPR certification
- 2) Criminal Reference Check is required for placement at an ambulance service
- 3) Completion of the Confederation College Health Questionnaire that is mailed with your Offer of Admission. This requires proof of immunity and TB skin test.
- 4) An Ontario Class "G" drivers license with eligibility to acquire an Ontario Class "F".

## **Physical Demands**

This program demands physical capabilities to facilitate the lifting and supporting of patients, maneuvering hospital equipment and fine motor skills for completion of technical tasks.
